Aims and objectives	<p>The Framework Scoping Study (FSS) is a 5 month project running from April to August 2004. The overall project aim is to develop a common means of articulating the JISC frameworks and services. The project has the following objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To collate analyse and map JISC development activities associated with the three main framework and architecture initiatives</li> <li>• To gather user requirements relating to these three areas</li> <li>• To develop a set of common conceptual and terminological elements on which a visual planning tool can be based and which will stimulate the JISC cross framework agenda</li> <li>• To develop a visual planning tool to allow JISC to examine strategic issue across frameworks including identification of points of commonality and difference across the JSIC community and of how provision relates to need.</li> </ul> <p><b>The aims and objectives of this session are:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To explain the rationale for the FSS</li> <li>• To describe the model driven approach adopted in this study</li> <li>• To demonstrate modelling tools and techniques used</li> </ul> <p>To report on progress and outcomes from initial stages of the work</p>
