

# Institutional Web Management: The Joined-Up Web

To be held on 6-8th September 2000 at the University of Bath

## **About the Workshop**

The *Institutional Web Workshop: The Joined-up Web* is the fourth in the series of annual workshops aimed at institutional Web managers in the Higher and Further Education communities. The workshop will consist of a mixture of presentations, discussion groups and hands-on sessions.

The theme of this year's workshop is "The Joined-Up Web". The workshop will address the development of services which are integrated with the business processes of universities, as well as addressing many of the technical, managerial and resourcing issues faced by Web managers. Topics to be covered include E-Commerce, E-Learning, Content Management Systems, Web Strategies, Resource Issues, etc.

### Who Should Attend?

The workshop is intended for those involved in the management of institutional Web services. This can include members of institutional Web teams, policy makers, managers and support staff.

Although aimed primarily at the HE and FE communities, the workshop may also be of interest to related public sector organisations, such as libraries, museums and archives.

## Where and When?

The workshop will take place on 6-8<sup>th</sup> September 2000 at the University of Bath.

## Costs

The workshop will cost £230 or £245 for members of the Higher and Further Education communities. This will include entrance to all sessions, meals, workshop materials and social events.
