Aims Of This Exercise

This exercise is intended for hands-on / discussion group use. The aims of the exercise are to identify the different ways in which institutional search engines can be accessed and to consider the issues involved in widening the access.

1.1 The OMNI Interface to Search Engines

Go to the URL `<http://www.omni.ac.uk/other-search/>`. Experiment with the search engines which are accessible from this page.

What are the advantages in providing this type of interface to subject-specific search engines?

1.2 LSE's Interface to Global Search Engines

Go to the URL `<http://www.lse.ac.uk/INTERNET/>`. Scroll down to the heading labelled **Why not search the Net straight away?** Use the search engines available from beneath this heading.

1.3 Unis4ne Interface to Institutional Search Engines in the North East

Go to the URL `<http://www.unis4ne.ac.uk/webadmin/search.htm>`. Use this interface to search a single University. Then use the interface to search the Durham and Sunderland University web sites.
